New Community Centre Closer ...again

The Wairarapa Community Centre looks all set to open its refurbished doors at 41, Perry Street at the beginning of February next year. There have been some delays to progress because of difficulties gaining a fire permit and in appointing an appropriate builder to complete the necessary redevelopment work. At last, however, it seems these issues are resolved and it should be full steam ahead to get the work done as quickly as possible. Originally it was hoped that tenants would be in the new Centre before Christmas but a more realistic date for the transfers and official opening will now be the start of February.

Initially Green Dollars had been offered office space right alongside the main entrance to the Centre. Now, however, in order to accommodate another tenant who needed more space we've been asked to move to a larger office three doors down from reception where we will enjoy 30% more room but still pay the original rental. So, we gain more elbow room at no extra cost, the other tenant is happy and the Centre management is pleased. It looks like a "win/win/win" situation and we look forward to inviting you in to the new home of Green Dollars early in 2012.

OCTOBER MARKET - HIGH STREET, MASTERTON

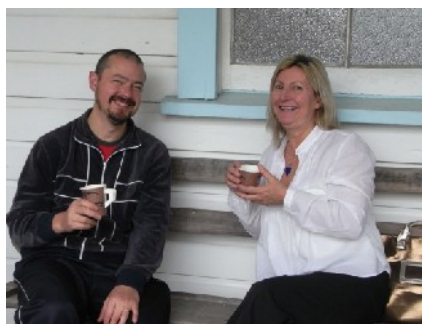

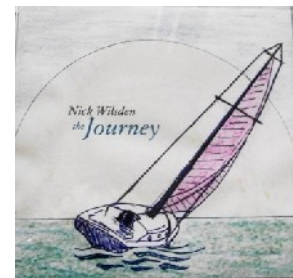

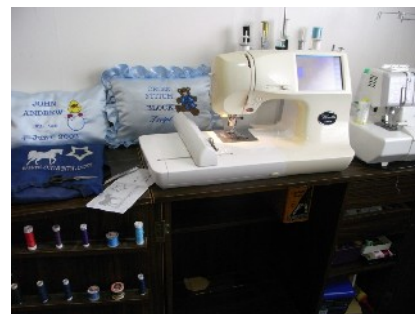
