### COMMUNITY CURRENCIES PRESENTATION Report by Kelby Courtney



Thomas H Greco Jr (pictured) gave a presentation on alternative currencies in Wellington recently. The focus of the talk was on how alternative currencies must play an important role to bring about change in light of the current world financial situation. Thomas began his presentation by informing us about the nuts and bolts of the current money system and how it is destined to perpetuate the "boom and bust" cycles that we are experiencing. He also outlined how U.S government debt had increased at an exponential rate far above current levels of G.DP. Thomas also

provided a social context to the presentation. He described how under the current financial system the vast majority of the population are being controlled by the vested interests of a small minority – the Bankers in collusion with the State Governments. In effect he spoke of how our rights are being subjugated under the current centralised system of exchange. A period of discussion followed the presentation which provoked lively debate amongst the large cross-section of people in the audience. The event was attended by members of the Green Party and other folks from various community based organisations.

Helen Dew helped organise the event with Paul Bruce – a Regional Councillor. The event paved the way for this weekend's Community Currencies Conference in Whanganui.


## A VARIETY OF MUSICAL SERVICES NOW ON OFFER
